- 1. Matter is heard in presence of the learned advocates representing the parties.
- Petitioner made an application for transfer in terms of the leave granted by a coordinate Bench vide order dated 2<sup>nd</sup> May, 2025 passed on a writ petition being WPA 22086 of 2024.
- Pursuant to such leave an application for transfer was made by the petitioner in prescribed proforma on medical ground.
- 4. Concerned District Inspector of Schools (SE), Nadia obtained medical report from concerned medical authorities. A communication dated 29<sup>th</sup> August, 2025 of the respondent no.6 is placed before this Court enclosing medical report signed on 13<sup>th</sup> June, 2025 by the medical experts.
- 5. Such communication dated 29th August, 2025

- enclosing medical report is taken on record.
- 6. On perusal of the medical report, it does not appear that transfer of the petitioner on medical ground is justified.
- 7. Therefore, Court finds no ground to interfere with the decision of the respondent no.6 as contained in memo dated 22<sup>nd</sup> July, 2025 whereby application of the petitioner seeking transfer on medical ground was rejected.
- 8. The writ petition stands dismissed.
- 9. However, there shall be no order as to costs.
- 10. Urgent photostat certified copy of this order, if applied for, be given to the learned Advocates for the parties on the usual undertakings.
